Mayor proclaims WECAA's *DC Diplomatic Day of Kindness* Wednesday, November 8 ---Event promotes collaboration between Foreign Embassies and Covenant House--

Washington, D.C. – November 7, 2023... A new initiative aimed at fostering goodwill and community engagement is set to take place tomorrow, Wednesday, November 8, 2023. Mayor Muriel Bowser acknowledged Washington Educational and Cultural Attaché Association's (WECAA) leadership in launching the first *DC Diplomatic Day of Kindness*.

The DC Diplomatic Day of Kindness was conceived as an opportunity for various foreign embassies to come together and make a positive impact in their home city of Washington, D.C. This event will mark the beginning of an ongoing annual tradition.

This year, the event will benefit Covenant House, a renowned non-profit organization located at 2001 Mississippi Ave SE in Washington, D.C. Over 20 embassies have generously volunteered their time and resources to engage with the residents of Covenant House between 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm. They will be serving international food, providing entertainment, and most importantly, engaging with and supporting the residents of Covenant House. Kimberly A. Bassett, Secretary of State, will read the Mayor's Proclamation during the celebration.

Among the noteworthy embassies participating in this noble cause include Armenia, Bahamas, Bangladesh, Burundi, Central African Republic, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Egypt, Gambia, Honduras, Kosovo, Malaysia, Morocco, Mozambique, Nicaragua, Oman, Qatar, Serbia, Sierra Leone, Slovak Republic, Sri Lanka, Trinidad & Tobago, Tunisia, and Ukraine. Each embassy is dedicated to making a meaningful contribution to the local community, particularly to the residents of Covenant House. Cultural attaches Joan Brammer from Trinidad and Tobago and Fatima Aboulfaraj of Morocco comprise the leadership of WECAA.

Covenant House is a respected non-profit organization that serves as a refuge for Washington, D.C. youth, providing essential assistance and resources to help them rebuild their lives and secure a brighter future.

The *DC Diplomatic Day of Kindness* is an opportunity for embassies to showcase their cultural heritage, share international cuisine, and foster understanding among diverse communities. Moreover, it serves as a platform for diplomats and their staff to actively engage in philanthropy and positively impact the lives of residents at Covenant House.
